



## ARBONNE NON-ANIMAL TESTING POLICY – OVERVIEW



### **A History of Non-Animal Testing (NAT)**

Since the company was founded in 1980, Arbonne has had a strict policy against testing on animals and our formulas have never contained animal products or by-products. This vegan philosophy extends to every ingredient we use and every finished formula we sell. This standard is upheld as a key part of our Ingredient Policy.

### **Official Documentation – Written Statements and Declarations**

Arbonne's ingredient suppliers submit individual ingredient Non-Animal Tested (NAT) statements and Arbonne also provides a Finished Good Non-Animal Testing declaration for each final product we sell.

### **Industry Standards**

Over the last decade, the industry at large has also adopted a Non-Animal Testing standard. Today, the cosmetics industry has moved away from accepting ingredients that are tested on animals or associating with any suppliers who test on animals.

### **Global Compliance**

Now, like Arbonne, other companies cannot sell products in the European Union (EU) without the proper Non-Animal Testing documentation on their ingredients and finished goods.



### **Vegan Certification Requirement**

As a vegan company, Arbonne is required to show Non-Animal Tested certification at the time of application for each new product. This important, third-party Certified Vegan registration applies to the exclusion of animal products and by-products in our formulas, and also certifies that the formulas are not tested on animals.
